# 20 REVIEW OF HACKNEY CARRIAGE AND PRIVATE HIRE DRIVERS' LICENCES - MR

A report of the Director of Law and Property was submitted on a review of the hackney carriage and private hire drivers' licences issued to Mr J A in the light of a breach of condition on his private hire licence in that he was not displaying a roof sign on his vehicle.

Mr J A was not in attendance at the meeting and a reason for his absence had not been received. As Mr J A had been informed by letter that the case would be heard in his absence should he not attend, consideration was accordingly given to this matter and it was

#### RESOLVED

That, following careful consideration of the information contained in the report submitted, the private hire drivers' licence only issued to Mr J A be suspended for a period of two weeks from the date of this meeting of the Committee.

GRANT OF PRIVATE HIRE DRIVER'S LICENCE - MR M S A

A report of the Director of Law and Property was submitted on an application made by Mr M S A for the grant of a private hire driver's licence in the light of his failure to pass the private hire driver's knowledge test on three separate occasions.

Mr M S A was in attendance together with his representative who highlighted a possible variation in the way the policy relating to the holding of further tests was being applied. This matter would be investigated further by the Licensing Officer.
